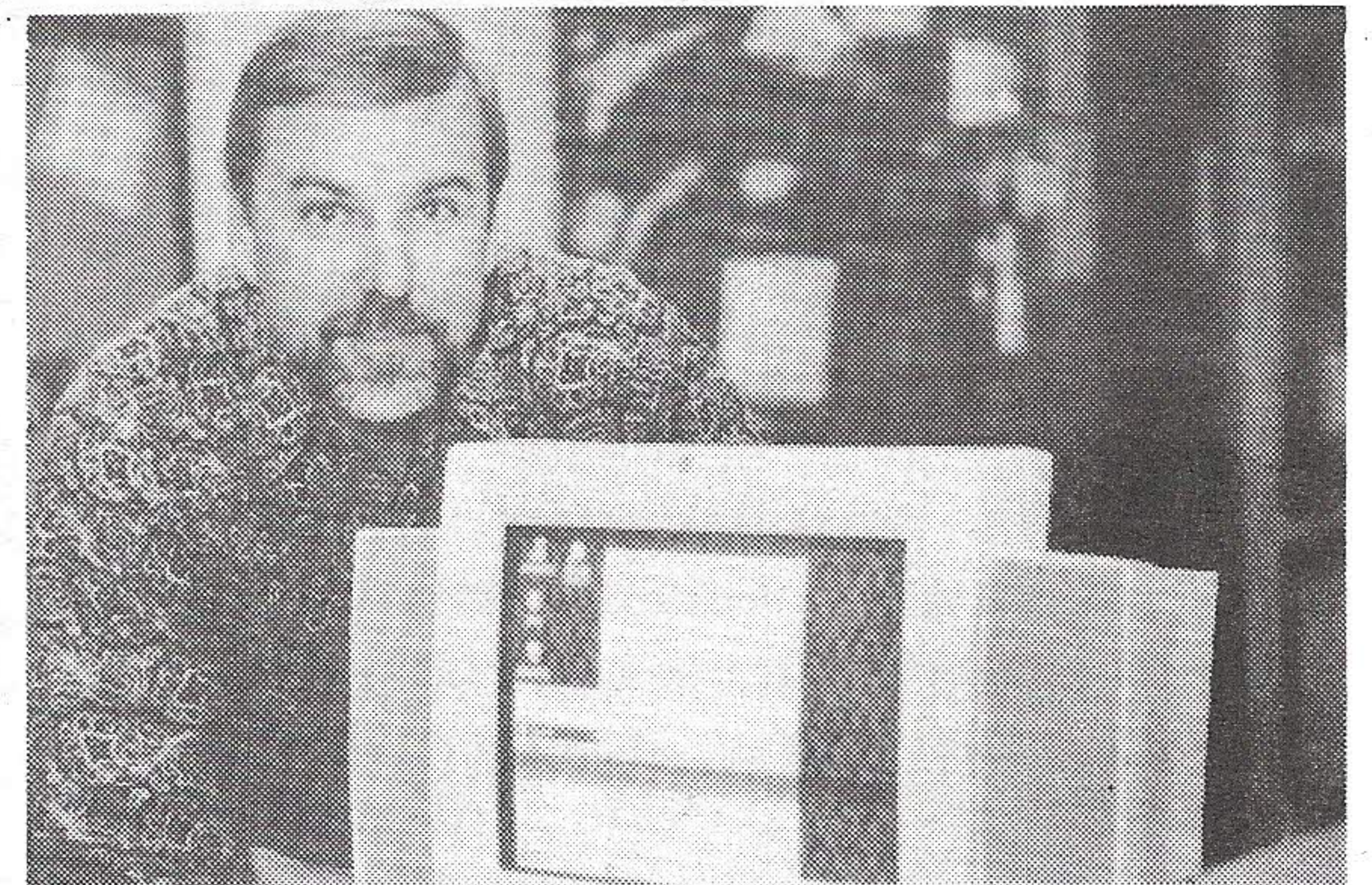

Enid has always been admired for its progressive and effective public school system. Now, in addition to its outstanding academic and athletic programs, Enid Public Schools is dedicated to offering its community improved technology through grants from Oklahoma's State Departments of Education and Vocational Education and Southwestern Bell.

One of the most far-reaching improvements has been the development of the Community Resource Learning Center. **The Community Resource Learning Center located at Waller Junior High School has been developed to serve the community by providing free educational course offerings in computer technology and internet search nights.** The center has seventeen state of the art computer stations connected to a T-1 line to provide users with fast and reliable net searches.

Starting in January of 1998 the resource center will be open to the public. The center will offer free internet search nights every Thursday evening from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m.. The center will also offer free to the public community education courses in computer technology.
